The regular monthly meeting of the Hickory Township Board of Supervisors held at the Hickory Township Municipal Building was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman, Michael E. Hall.

Supervisor Fabian made a motion to accept the October 25, 2023 budget workshop meeting minutes without correction. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Dean. All in favor. Motion carried.

The October Treasurer's Report was read. Supervisor Fabian made a motion to pay all regular, incoming bills and payroll. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Dean. All in favor. Motion carried.

Report of Police Activities for the month of October: 2 suspicious activities; 2 reckless driving complaints; 4 burglar alarms; 1 hit & run crash; 1 false alarm; 1 suspicious vehicle; 5 assists (police, fire, EMS & public); 1 theft complaint; 1 animal complaint; 1 welfare check

New Business: Visit Lawrence County, Pennsylvania submitted a donation request seeking funding for their annual tourism booklet. This matter died due to lack of action, support or comment.

Supervisor Dean made the motion to approve the proposed 2024 Budget of Hickory Township for advertising. Fabian seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried. The Secretary was instructed to advertise & publicly post the proposed 2024 Budget. The Supervisors intend to adopt the 2024 Budget at the next regular meeting December 4, 2023.

Supervisor Fabian made the motion to approve Resolution No. 2023-11 to renew the Comcast Cable Franchise Agreement. Supervisor Hall seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

The Supervisors intend to continue roadside tree trimming in 2024. They preliminarily identified Patton Road and Bowden Road as the next areas needing attention. A final determination will be made after the annual comprehensive road inspection.

The Supervisors identified the following as potential 2024 road work: 1) Hunter Lane: pave entire length; 2) Fairground Road: replace cross pipe and paving patched; 3) Bodziach & Patterson Roads: seal coat (tar & chip). A final determination will be made after the annual comprehensive road inspection.

Motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:08 P.M. was made by Supervisor Fabian and seconded by Supervisor Hall. All in favor. Motion carried.
