

**HICKORY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING
February 2, 2026**

The regular monthly meeting of the Hickory Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman, Christopher J. Fabian.

Supervisor Hall made a motion to accept the January 2026 organization and regular meeting minutes without correction. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Fabian. All in favor. Motion carried.

The January Treasurer’s Report was read. Supervisor Hall made the motion to accept the Treasurer’s report and pay all regular bills, incoming bills and payroll. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Fabian. All in favor. Motion carried.

Announcements: Lawrence County Treasurer, Richard L. Rapone, will be collecting County tax payments at the Hickory Township Municipal Building April 9, 2026 from 10:00 am -12:00 pm. as part of the Annual Tax Outreach.

New Business: Supervisor Fabian made a motion to continue participation in the annual COSTARS Sodium Chloride Contract for period of August 2026 – July 2027 with an estimated salt order of 100 short tons. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Hall. All in favor. Motion carried.

The tax collector’s bond has historically been shared with Laurel School District, Hickory Township and Scott Township all being listed on one bond. Laurel School District and Scott Township have indicated their interest in maintaining the agreement to all be listed on one bond and to continue to split payment of the premium for said bond. Payment of the bond premium will remain the same with the townships paying \$100.00 and Laurel School District paying the remainder. Supervisor Fabian moved that Hickory Township continue the agreement concerning the tax collector’s bond. Motion seconded by Supervisor Brown. All in favor. Motion carried.

Supervisor Hall made a motion to approve Resolution #2026-6 banning smoking, vaping and/or tobacco use on all township property inclusive of all township vehicles. Motion seconded by Supervisor Brown. All in favor. Motion carried.

Supervisor Brown submitted a letter to the Board of Supervisors requesting that he and his family be added to the Township health insurance plan. Supervisor Fabian made a motion to approve Brown’s request. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Hall. All in favor. Motion carried.

Supervisor Hall offered information on the updated dump truck bids, equipment packages, truck capabilities, weight, and municipal outfitting. There was a brief discussion. Supervisor Brown made a motion to approve the purchase of a new Mack MD7 dump truck chassis for \$103,177.53 with a municipal outfitting package by Stephenson Equipment, Inc. (SEI) for \$94,900.00. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Fabian. All in favor. Motion carried.

Supervisor Hall made the motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:18 P.M. Motion seconded by Supervisor Fabian. All in favor. Motion carried.
