Motion to accept the minutes from the February meeting without correction was made by Supervisor Hall and seconded by Supervisor Fabian. All in favor. Motion carried.

February Treasurer’s Report was provided. Motion to pay the current bills, payroll and all incoming, regular bills was made by Supervisor Fabian, seconded by Supervisor Dean. All in favor. Motion carried.

Public Comments: Rich Alley stated that he was involved in a traffic incident on S.R. 168. He nearly rolled his truck and ended up in a resident’s yard. He asked that the Hickory Police Department paint speed trap lines on S.R. 168 and slow down all the speeders in front of his store. Mr. Alley gave the Hickory Police authorization to sit on his property wherever it is most advantageous to enforce the speed limit.

Dick Jones questioned the mutual agreement with Shenango Township about plowing and salting Countyline Road. Supervisor Dean explained that Countyline Road is owned by multiple Townships and there is a verbal agreement that whichever Township gets to Countyline Road first will clear the road in the best interest of the safety of all residents. Dick Jones claims that he talked to Shenango Township and they told him that they will plow Countyline but they will not throw down aggregate or salt. Dick Jones was adamant that no more material be placed on the section of Countyline that is owned by Shenango Township. Supervisor Dean obliged.

Old Business: The Supervisors intend to perform a comprehensive road inspection to solidify 2022 road maintenance directives.

New Business: Supervisor Hall made a motion to approve the tax exoneration of Joseph E. Wilkins, Sr. in accordance with Lawrence County Tax Assessment Resolution #36757 dated February 2, 2022. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Fabian. All in favor. Motion carried.

Supervisor Hall made a motion to appoint Supervisor Fabian as the Hickory Township Voting Delegate for the 2022 PSATS Conference in Hershey. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Dean. All in favor. Motion carried.
